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# JBI Evidence Implementation Guidelines

*A Structured Approach to Translating Evidence into Practice*

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# Meaning of Evidence Implementation

**JBI evidence implementation** is the process of moving the best available evidence into real practice, policy, and healthcare decision-making.

It aims to reduce the gap between **what evidence recommends** and **what actually happens in clinical practice**.

*JBI describes evidence implementation as a practical approach that supports clinicians and teams to translate evidence into policy and practice through structured planning, audit, feedback, and change strategies.*

# 1 2 3 Key Principles of JBI Evidence Implementation

Principle	Description
Feasibility	Is the practice achievable in this clinical setting?
Appropriateness	Is it culturally and contextually fit?
Meaningfulness	Does it matter to patients and clinicians?
Effectiveness	Does it produce measurable outcomes?

*These four principles — known as **FAME** — underpin how JBI evaluates whether evidence should be implemented.*

# Key Factors for Successful Implementation

Evidence	Context	Facilitation
Implementation should be based on the best available evidence.	The local setting must be understood.	Change usually requires support from facilitators or change leaders.

*JBI emphasises that evidence, context, and facilitation interact during successful implementation.*

# JBI Seven-Phase Approach

Phase	Description
1. Identify the practice area	Select a clinical issue or gap in practice that needs improvement.
2. Engage stakeholders	Involve clinicians, managers, patients, and other relevant people.
3. Assess current practice	Conduct a baseline audit using evidence-based criteria.
4. Identify barriers & facilitators	Explore why current practice does or does not follow best evidence. <b>FEEDBACK</b> — Baseline audit results are shared with the team; gaps trigger barrier analysis.
5. Develop implementation strategies	Plan targeted actions to address barriers.
6. Implement strategies	Apply the action plan in the clinical setting. Strategies are applied based on audit findings
7. Re-audit and sustain change	Measure improvement and plan how to maintain the change. <b>FOLLOW-UP AUDIT</b> — Second audit conducted to measure improvement.



# Key Message

*JBI evidence implementation is not only about knowing the evidence.  
It is about changing practice, measuring improvement,  
and sustaining evidence-based care.*
