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Assist. Prof. Dr. Porawan Witwaranukool is the director of JBI-MURSON, Thailand, and a nursing lecturer in the adult and gerontological nursing division at the Ramathibodi School of Nursing, Faculty of Medicine, Ramathibodi Hospital, Mahidol University. She is an expert in quantitative research, systematic reviews, cancer support, nursing education, and intervention design. Her expertise is demonstrated through her work in symptom management for individuals with cancer and her significant contributions to gynecological nursing.



Ratanaporn Jerawatana is an Advanced Practice Nurse (APN) in the Nursing Service Division, Faculty of Medicine, Ramathibodi Hospital, Mahidol University, Thailand. She specializes in diabetes care and has extensive experience in enhancing the quality of care for all types of diabetes patients. Her work includes the development of DSMES programs and CNPG for diabetes. In addition to her role as an educator and researcher in diabetes nursing, she is also an executive committee member of national organizations, such as the Thai Association of Diabetes Educators, the Diabetes Association of Thailand, and the Ministry of Public Health of Thailand. As a representative of the nursing profession, she plays a key role in developing and standardizing diabetes care systems in Thailand.



Dr. Ratchanok Phonyiam is a nursing instructor in the Department of Community Health Nursing at Ramathibodi School of Nursing, Mahidol University, Thailand. Her research interests include lifestyle modification, social determinants of health, health disparities, community health nursing, and women's health. She focuses on type 2 diabetes mellitus across the lifespan, from childhood through pregnancy, postpartum, and adulthood. She conducts systematic reviews and meta-analyses on school-based interventions to prevent type 2 diabetes in children and adolescents. Additionally, she is conducting a qualitative study to explore healthcare providers' perspectives on managing diabetes during pregnancy, with the goal of identifying knowledge gaps and developing evidence-based implementation strategies.







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Dr. Donruedee Kamkhoad is a nursing instructor in the Pediatric Nursing Division at the Ramathibodi School of Nursing, Faculty of Medicine Ramathibodi Hospital, Mahidol University. Her research focuses on symptom management and nutrition in children with cancer. She also conducts systematic reviews to develop evidence-based guidelines for improving symptom management in pediatric oncology in Thailand.



Dr. Naoko Nishimura, PhD, RN., Professor (Child health Nursing) Faculty of Global Nursing, Otemae University, Director of Otemae Implementation centre: JBI affiliate group Her research topic is the relation between self-concept and body image in children with short stature and mother-infant interaction. She got certificates for TtT in 2018, and TtT of EBCFP in 2019. She has been commencing the CSRT since 2019, and the EITP since 2021 at Otemae Implementation centre: JBI affiliate group where she is a convener.



Ms. Ryoko Ikegami, RN., Chief nurse in charge of Education, Higashi-Ohmi General Medical Center.
